While works on immigrant communities and gender often position immigrant masculinities in relation to dominant white masculine normativity, Professor Thangaraj's presentation explores the means by which South Asian American men negotiate masculinity in relation to other men in their community, mainstream racializations, and other racialized masculinities. Through such an exploration, one can decipher the ways in which racializations as “terrorists” and “nerds” are negotiated and mediated through the racialization of black, Latino, and Asian American men.
